AUK concludes sponsorship of 26th annual Conference & Exhibition

KUWAIT CITY, March 19: The American University of Kuwait (AUK) has concluded its sponsorship of the 26th Annual Conference and Exhibition of the Special Libraries Association (SLA)—Arabian Gulf Chapter (AGC).
