

The Salem Witch Trials: What really happened and why?

The Salem witch trials took place in colonial Massachusetts from 1692 to 1693. While it was only one year, many consider this to be the darkest time in the state's history as paranoia and mass hysteria led to the unjust prosecution of over 200 people and the death of 20 people.

What happened:

There was an ongoing war between France and the English in the American colonies. Due to the influx of refugees, a huge strain was put on Salem's resources. This caused many people to be on edge and led to many arguments and problems. The Puritans blamed all this infighting on the Devil.

This is around the same time Salem had its first ordained minister, Samuel Parris. The minister's daughter and niece both became ill and began having "fits" in which they would throw things, scream, utter odd words, and twist their bodies into strange positions. The local physician referred to the supernatural as a cause for these symptoms. Soon after that, another little girl began to experience the same thing.

The girls were pressured into telling authorities how this happened to them and so they gave three names. Tituba, the Parris' Indian slave, Sarah Good, a homeless woman, and Sarah Osborne, an elderly woman. Upon interrogating these women for several days, Miss Good and Miss Osborne insisted they were innocent, but Tituba confessed; saying that the devil came to her, and he demanded she does his bidding. She explained that there are more Witches within Salem's community looking to destroy the Puritans.

Now--- with Salem's community on edge, hysteria spread, and many were accused. As time went on, a special department was established for Witchcraft related matters. Over time, matters became worse as people began accusing others of Witchcraft with the sole evidence that they "had a dream this person was a Witch", and so that person was prosecuted. A respected minister, minister Mather attempted to convince the court to deny any accusations of this sort, but he was ignored. Mather's plea was followed by a plea from Mather's son who was Harvard's President at the time "it is better that ten Witches escape, rather than one innocent person be condemned."

By this time many people, mostly women, were in prison or were murdered. The Governor at this time, Governor Phipps ended the arrests once his wife was questioned for practicing witchcraft. He then released everyone who was arrested for Witchcraft, and so began the attempts to heal the damage done to the Salem community. Many court officials admitted that the trials were unlawful and attempted to mend the wounds caused to the families of those falsely accused of Witchcraft by awarding them money.



families of those falsely accused of Witchcraft by awarding them money. The general court ordered a day of fasting and soul-searching for the tragedy that was the trials. All the official documents are now housed in the Salem Witch Museum in hopes of preserving the history of the trials and the hard lesson this town had to learn about the consequences of mass hysteria.

Tituba's confession:

Evidence concluded by Historians shows that Tituba had never practiced magic a day in her life. It was the misconceptions pushed onto Indians by Puritans that enabled Tituba's confession to be taken as fact and used as evidence.

Many Historians today believe that Tituba did not practice Witchcraft. She only confessed because she was in prison for several days, and because she knew she would be freed if she accused others of practicing Witchcraft. Along with these facts, Tituba came from a different background and culture which the Puritans associated with demonic power. Tituba's background coupled with the fact that her confession was all the authorities needed to launch an official investigation made her confession essential to the events that followed. Had Tituba not confessed the trials might have gone differently, there might not have been trials at all.

What was really happening:

A study published in science in 1976 by psychologist Linnda Caporael calling the cause for the supernatural symptoms that had befallen the girls to be caused by a fungus ergot. This fungus can be found in rye and wheat. Toxicologists conclude that consuming food affected by ergot can cause muscle spasms, vomiting, hallucinations, and delusions. Experts also say that this fungus thrives in warm, damp climates such as the climate of Salem Massachusetts.

“There they are!”


“After them!”




During his time Fowler like many men of his time, loved social clubs and events.

The way Stoker wrote Dracula was through diary entries, letters, and news articles. The diary entries and letters are a unique way of giving the reader a feel for what Dracula is going through, while the other side of the coin is what the town is seeing and reporting through the newspapers. It's a unique and different way of reading than a regular novel. Not to mention that these days Dracula is recognized as one of the most famous pieces of gothic fiction in history too!

I encourage anyone who loves Gothic fiction and other dark horror stories to read "Dracula"! Delve into the world created by Bram Stoker or Stephen King's "Salem's Lot." All vampire stories are welcome!

The castle stands on an edge of a cliff and since it's a castle in Romania, it showcases true Gothic designs.




Ravenous Devils:


The Blackout Club:





The Babylonians named Scorpio to refer to a specific Scorpion and the meaning is "The creature with the burning sting."


Antares is the biggest star in Scorpio's constellation, and it means "The rival of Mars."
