KUWAIT CITY, April 3, (KUNA): His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Sabah Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah received the visiting South African Minister of International Relations and Cooperation Naledi Pandor on Thursday.

During the encounter, held in the presence of Kuwait's Foreign Minister and State Minister for Cabinet Affairs Sheikh Dr. Ahmad Nasser Al-Muhammad Al-Sabah, His Highness the prime minister was handed a letter from South African President Cyril Ramaphosa addressed to His Highness the Amir Sheikh Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah.

Meanwhile, Kuwait's Foreign Minister and State Minister for Cabinet Affairs Sheikh Dr. Ahmad Nasser Al-Muhammad Al-Sabah met with the visiting South African

Minister of International Relations and Cooperation Naledi Pandor on Thursday.

The two sides discussed strengthening their countries' close and solid bilateral relations and reviewed all aspects of close cooperation, particularly on the economic, trade and investment spectrums.

During the meeting, views were exchanged on recent developments on the regional and international fronts. Both were in mutual agreement on all the matters discussed.

They also discussed cooperation on efforts to tackle the COVID-19 pandemic and finding a solution to crises affecting the region.

The Chinese official went on to praise the wisdom, sophistication and balance of Kuwait's foreign policy, led by its leadership, and its efforts to consolidate the foundations of peace and stability in the region, according to a Kuwait Embassy statement.

For his part, Ambassador Hayat said the bilateral talks focused on strengthening cooperation, adding that both share a common aspiration to elevate

this cooperation to a wider scope, in line with the directions of their leaderships.

He noted to cooperation in the "political, economic, commercial, investment, cultural, scientific and academic" domains.

Kuwait is greatly interested in developing friendly relations with Beijing, which have achieved positive results over the years, he added, hoping this would be "mutually beneficial" to both countries.

MEW seeks approval for smart meters project's second phase

KUWAIT CITY, April 3: According to informed sources from the Ministry of Electricity and Water, the ministry had addressed the Ministry of Finance and the Fatwa and Legislation Department to obtain the necessary approvals regarding the tender for the second phase of the project of smart electricity and water meters, reports Al-Rai daily.

They said, "The second phase will include the supply and installation of 200,000 electricity meters and 300,000 water meters, which is the number that was included in the tender for smart water meters and was canceled".

The sources indicated that the ministry represented by the team overseeing the tender has gained considerable experience in preparing documents for the tender, which will be put forward for participation in preparing the tender for the first phase.

They revealed that the meters of the first phase will be allocated to the investment and commercial sectors, and will be distributed to all governorates, indicating that the ministry aims to supply 800,000 electricity meters in several stages to cover all sectors in the future.

On a different note, the Central Agency for Public Tenders (CAPT) has agreed to the ministry's request to put up three tenders to the companies

classified with CAPT. These include a tender for the supply of longitudinal connections to a monoblock oil cable, a tender for maintenance work of the secondary transfer stations for Ahmadi Governorate, and a tender for the replacement of 132 kV circuit breakers and their accessories at the Shuyukh power and water distillation plant.

According to sources, the three tenders come within the framework of the ministry's annual program to conduct the necessary maintenance for its facilities in order to develop, modernize and raise its efficiency to bear the loads, especially during the summer season when the demand for electricity increases due to the high temperature.

In addition, the ministry obtained a direct contract to repair three transmission stations in Sabah Al-Ahmad marine area for a total amount of KD 720,000 for a period of eight months as part of its plan to modernize, develop and raise the efficiency of the main stations responsible for transmitting electrical energy from the production stations to the secondary transfer stations.

Also, the ministry's personnel administration sector transferred excellent work bonuses to the accounts of 38 employees who had previously filed their grievances about the bonuses.

Arab League calls for boosting cooperation with Japan

KUWAIT CITY, April 3, (KUNA): Kuwait Deputy Foreign Minister Ambassador Majdi Al-Dhafeeri, on Thursday, headed the Kuwaiti delegation in the second online session of the ministerial meeting for the Arab-Japanese political dialogue.

The session witnessed the participation of Japanese Foreign Minister Toshimitsu Motegi, Qatari Foreign Minister Mohammad bin Abdulrahman Al-Thani, Arab League Secretary-General Ahmad Abul Gheit and representatives of Arab states.

During his speech and regarding the coronavirus situation that the world is going through, Ambassador Al-Dhafeeri praised the effective contributions of the Arab countries and Japan through the global initiative (COVAX) aimed at enabling countries around the world to obtain safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines.

Al-Dhafeeri also shed light on the historical and deep-rooted ties between Kuwait and Japan, hailing the bilateral relations between the two countries, which involved important and fruitful cooperation.

Furthermore, he noted that the total volume of trade exchange between Kuwait and Japan in the last two years 2019-2020 reached more than USD three billion, adding that Kuwait was ranked third among

oil-exporting countries to Japan, as Kuwaiti oil exports to Japan in 2019-2020 amounted in value to nearly USD 11.3 billion.

On the other hand, Ambassador Al-Dhafeeri stressed the Arab countries appreciate the humanitarian and assistance provided by Japan to the region states, expressing the Arabs' keenness to upgrade these relations.

Regarding the Palestinian cause, Al-

Trade exchange between the two sides reached about USD 108 billion in 2019, he said. He added that there is a triple partnership between the league, Japan and the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) since 2019 to execute cultural and development programs and projects.
