American University of Kuwait students visit NATO HQ

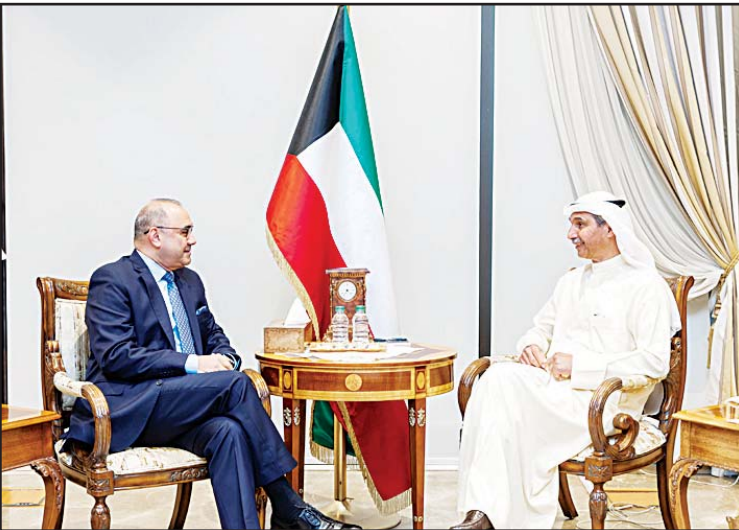

Amb. Al-Sabeeh drew upon his expertise within the political field to offer students strategies of negotiation in alignment with Kuwait foreign policy. 'Electronic job file'

Social Affairs 'introduces' first phase of automated leave system for employees

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 20: The financial and administrative affairs, planning and administrative development sectors of the Ministry of Social Affairs have completed the first phase of launching the automated system for registering employees to obtain sick and annual leaves and permission, via what is known as the "electronic job file", to address any shortcomings or errors that occurred previously and caused financial or moral harm to the concerned party, reports Al-Jarida daily.

Reliable sources from the ministry said at this stage only the employees working in the Ministries Complex are included, and the Administrative Affairs Administration has begun to receive leaves, sicknesses and permissions for employees automatically through the "application" explaining that this will be followed by four other stages.

The departments outside the complex include: the departments of social care homes, the family care department employees (external units), the social development center employees, and the cooperative societies (the co-operative supervision and inspection department employees).

The sources pointed out that the new service allows the employee to submit a regular or sick leave or permission, after entering a user name and password that belongs to him, and then submit his request to the "administrative

affairs" immediately, without having to wait several days for the administration to receive these requests.

The ministry noted that many employees, especially those working in external departments and units (outside the ministries complex), were subjected to injustice and salary deductions and in some cases their pay check was withheld as a result of interruption from work and failure to prove attendance and departure through the "fingerprint" system due to the delay in the arrival of their leave requests to the competent department, in addition to some of them being affected by non-receipt of requests for permission when the 30% of attendance and leave, on the basis of which the annual evaluations of employees which is why they were affected during evaluation of their job performance.

The sources added that "the computer department in the administrative, planning and development sector is currently working to launch the rest of the stages in succession, to be completed in full to cover all the ministry's employees within 3 months maximum, so that all employees can benefit from it, especially as it will be the gateway to transform "administrative affairs" into a smart department by eliminating paper transactions and expanding the use of automated systems, in order to facilitate employees and protect their rights."

Kuwait News Agency (KUNA) met with several of said youth who expressed their deep desire to break the mold and to embody the saying, "If you do what you love, you'll

never work a day in your life."

Art studio owner, Dalal Al-Hashel said that she was proud to be one of the first in Kuwait to open a space dedicated to "latte art", a discipline focusing on creating art from pour micro-foams in cups of coffee.

Al-Hashel revealed that she began her quest in 2021, starting women-only classes in latte art, which proved to be very popular and lucrative.

On his part, coffee roastery owner Fawaz Nasser said that the initial seeds for his business were conceptualized during the 2020 COVID-19 lockdown.

Post-lockdown measures, Nasser and his partner traveled abroad to gain experience and once back home, start their coffee roastery business.

"There were many trials I faced due to being a youth and not having the necessary capital to open the business," indicated Nasser who had to talk a bank loan to kick-start his quest to provide topnotch coffee for clients.

Similarly, Yasmeen Mohammad, a ceramic and clay artist, indicated that she did not know that her passion for her art would lead to opening a business.

Dream

Prior to pursuing her dream, Yasmeen was a government employee who took a leap of faith by quitting her day job and first opening a shop at home.

The home business was followed by a shop opening, which then turned into a showroom where she would provide classes in ceramic and clay art for anyone interested.

In reaction to the youths' passion, several members of the public expressed their support.

Abu Yousef, a 74-year-old senior citizen, gave his approval and support to the youth, saying that what they were doing was not very far from what the old generation pursued in terms of hard work and determination.

Um Manal, also another senior citizen, expressed pride in the youths' dreams of a better future, saying that his son was a car mechanic that left his government job to seek his passion, adding that his shop employs both Kuwaitis and residents.

Following are the main polling centers for each constituency:

First Constituency: Abdullah Abdullatif Al-Omar School for Boys in Mishref

Second Constituency: Ibn Rushd Elementary School for Boys in Faiha

Third Constituency: Odailiya Elementary School for Girls

Fourth Constituency: Andalus Elementary School for Girls

Fifth Constituency: Atuqa Bint Abdulmutaleb Secondary School for Girls in Jaber Al-Ali.

A total of 759 polling precincts in 114 schools – 368 for men and 391 for women – are allocated for the five constituencies as follows: 93 for the First Constituency, 91 for the Second Constituency, 135 for the Third Constituency, 201 for the

Fourth Constituency and 239 for the Fifth Constituency.

Meanwhile, former MP and Fourth Constituency candidate Marzouq Khalifa Al-Khalifa, who was born in 1961, is a Sunni.

He holds a Diploma in Civil Engineering and Master's Degree in Military Science. He served as Kuwait Army officer, participated in the Liberation War in 1990 and retired with the rank of colonel.

He contested the elections for the first time in 2014, ranking second in the Fourth Constituency with 4,005 votes and then 10th in 2016 with 2,874 votes. However, he lost his parliamentary membership in 2016 due to the election results appeal filed by Farraj Zebn Al-Erbeid who replaced him in the 10th place. He won again in the 2020 elections; taking the seventh spot in his constituency with 4,760 votes.
